

The Jelly Belly® Tastebud Test

The tongue is a muscle covered with little lumps called papillae. Receptor cells are found in the taste buds located at the base of the papillae. The receptor cells send a message to the brain through the nerves. This is how your brain is able to determine if you are eating food that is **sweet, sour, salty or bitter**.

There are ten Jelly Belly bean flavours listed below. Draw a line from each flavour to the part of the tongue (as shown in the drawing) that allows you to tell how it tastes. Some flavours may activate more than one taste.
